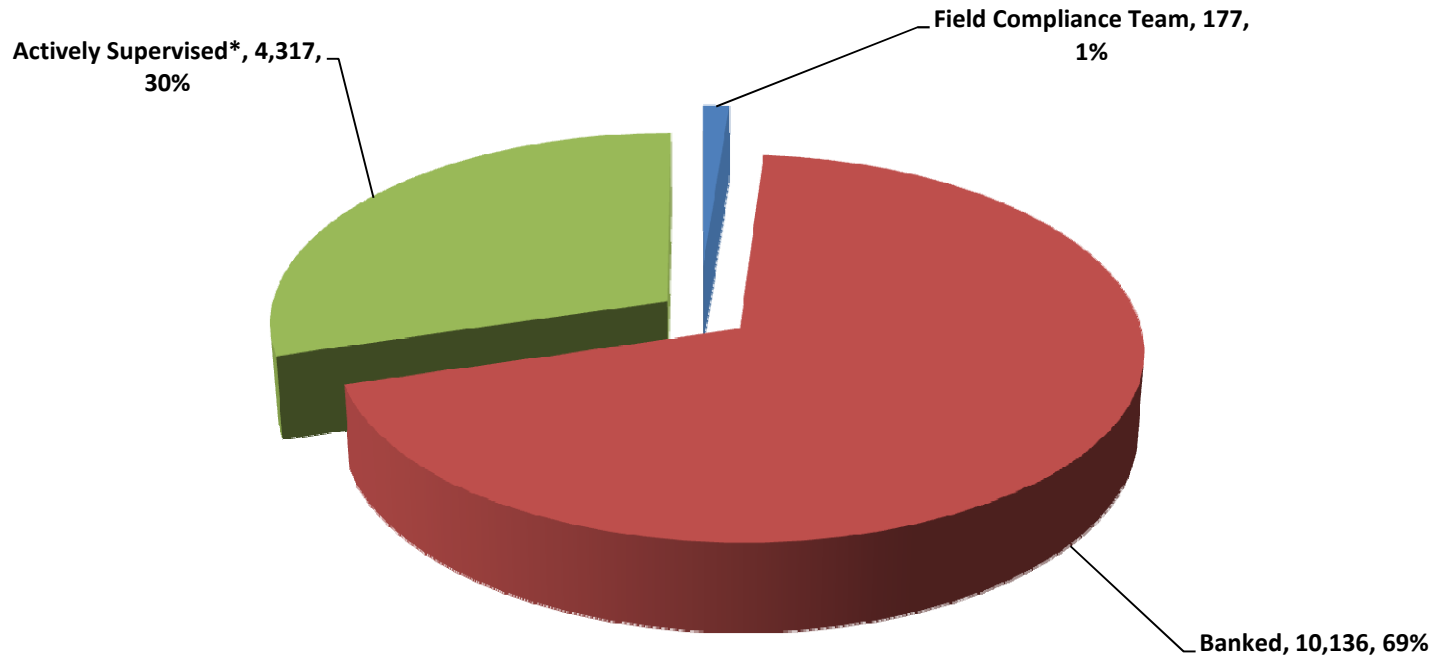

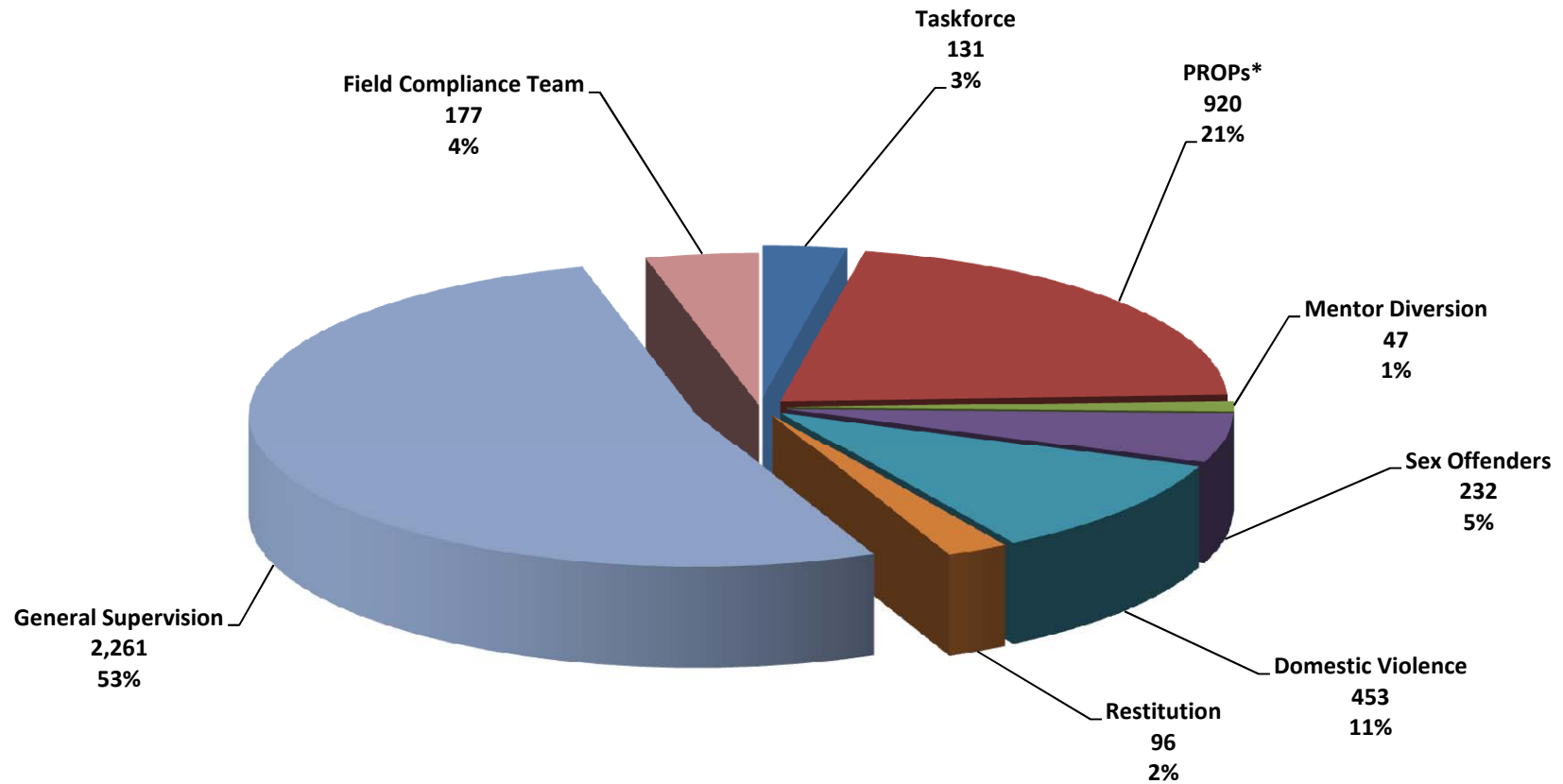

# ACTIVELY SUPERVISED ADULT CASES

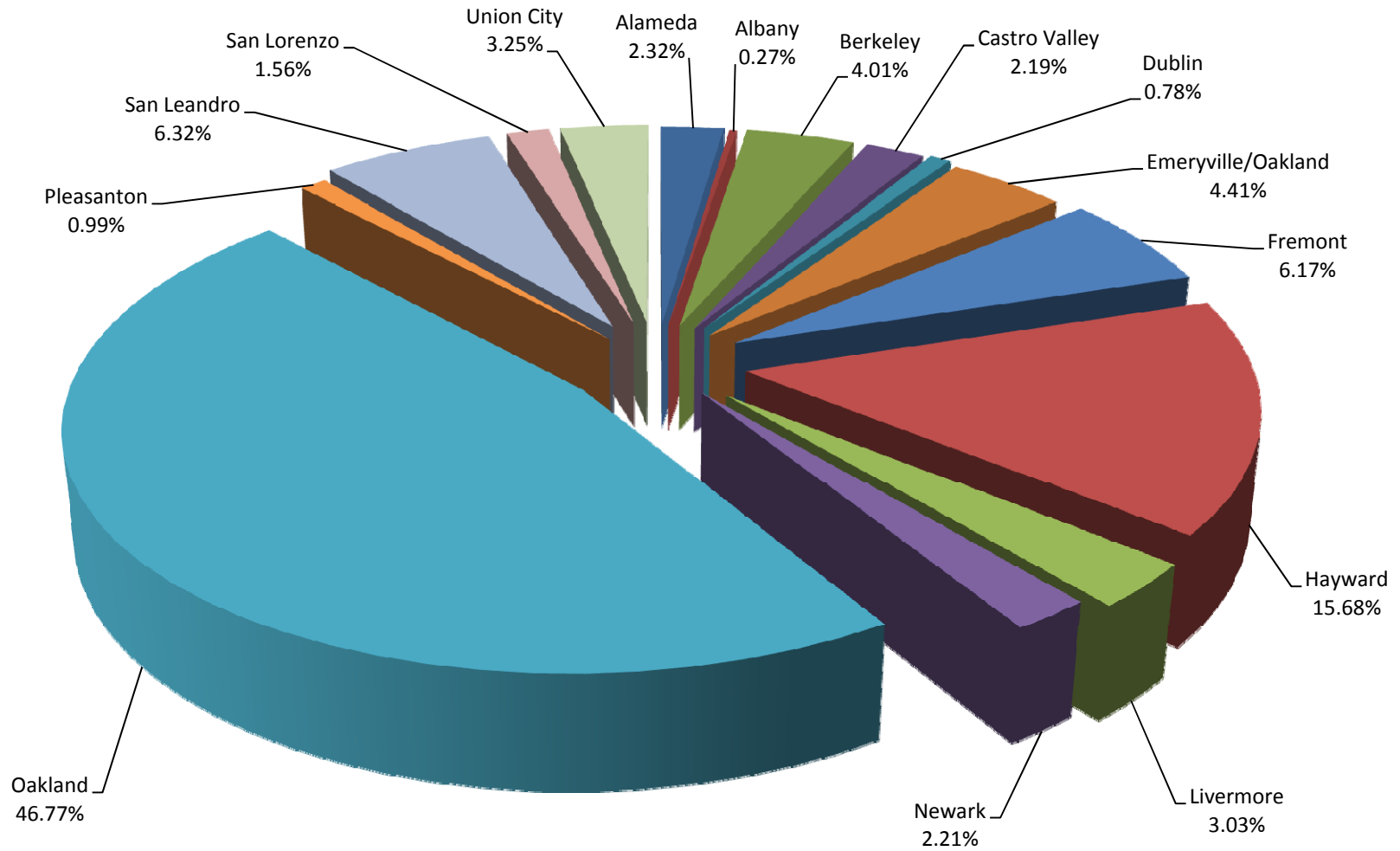

# CONCENTRATION OF ADULT PROBATIONERS PER CITY WITHIN ALAMEDA COUNTY

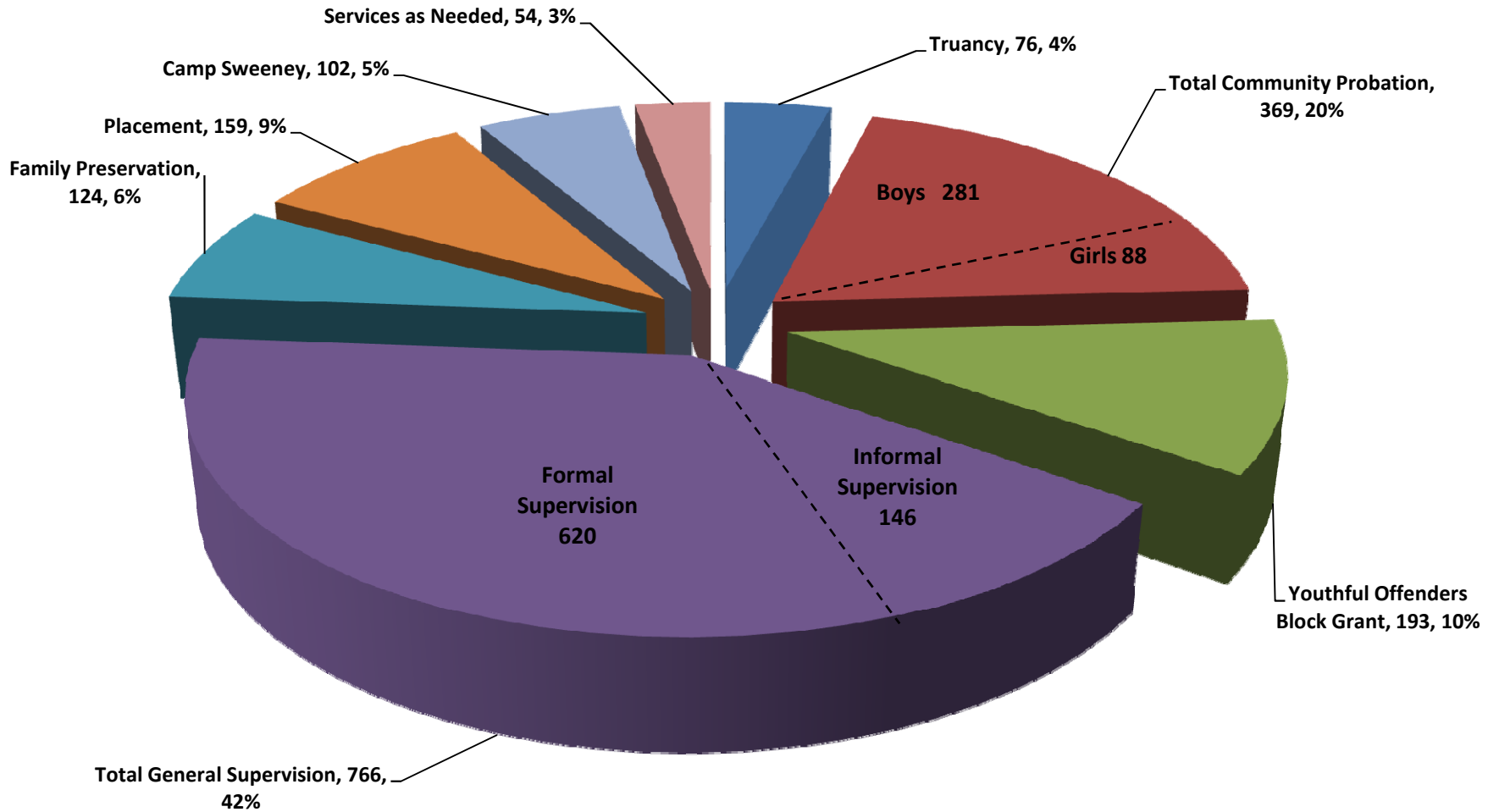

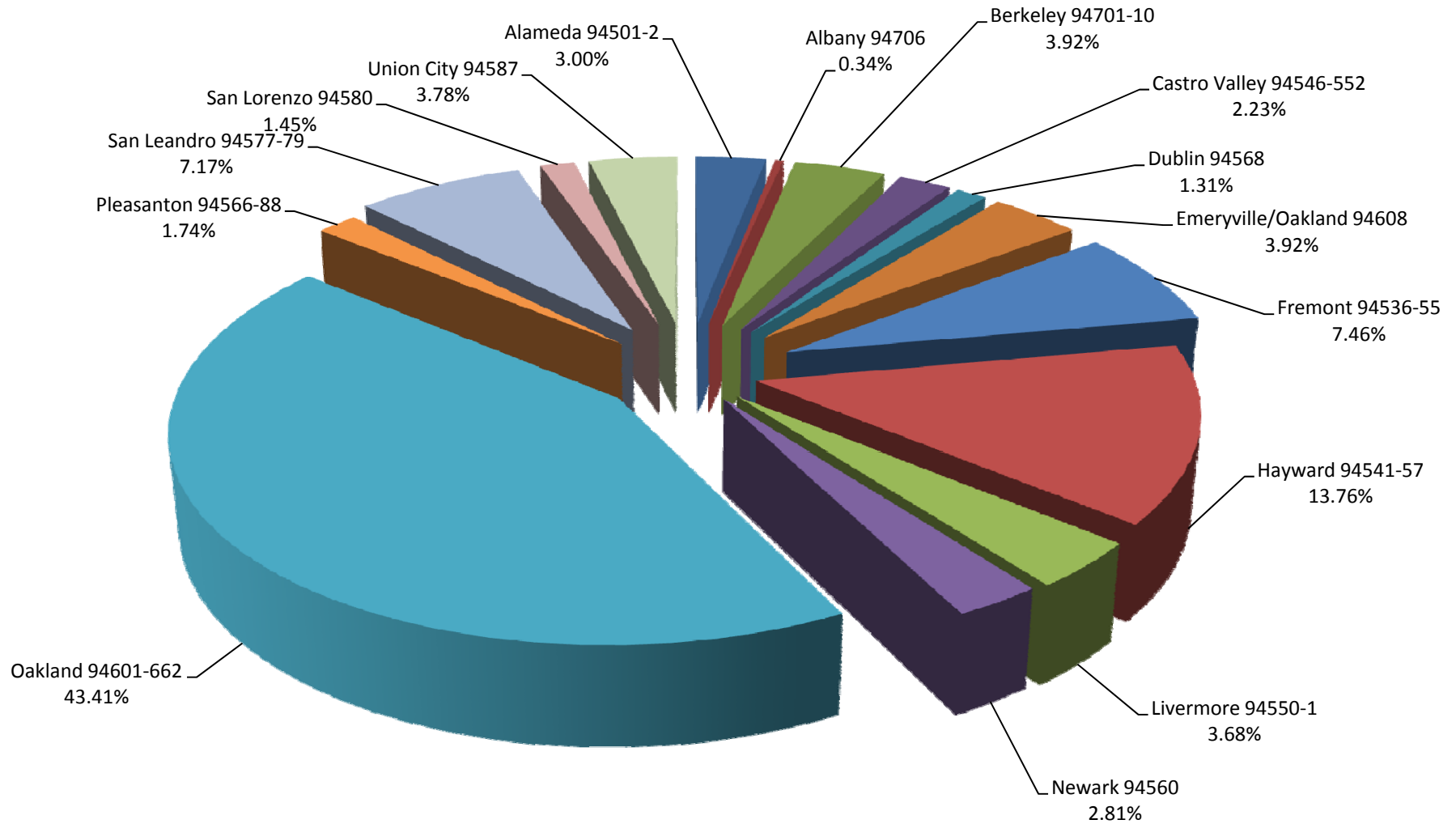

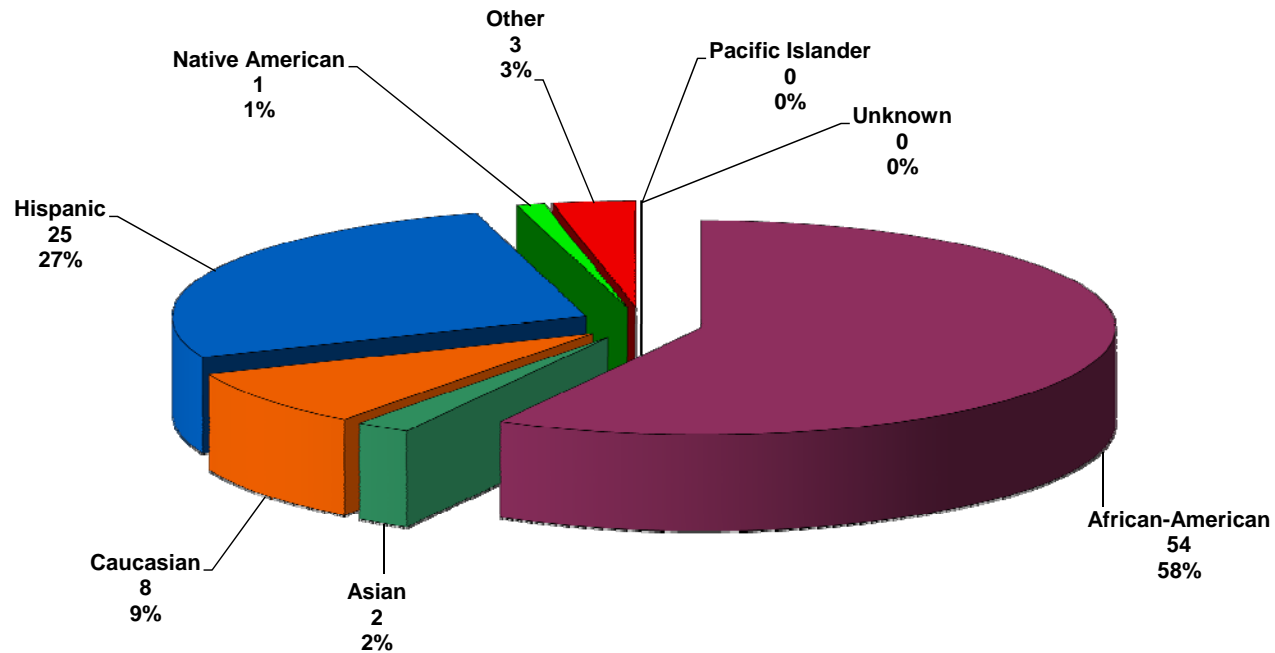
# CONCENTRATION OF JUVENILE PROBATIONERS PER CITY/ZIP CODE WITHIN ALAMEDA COUNTY

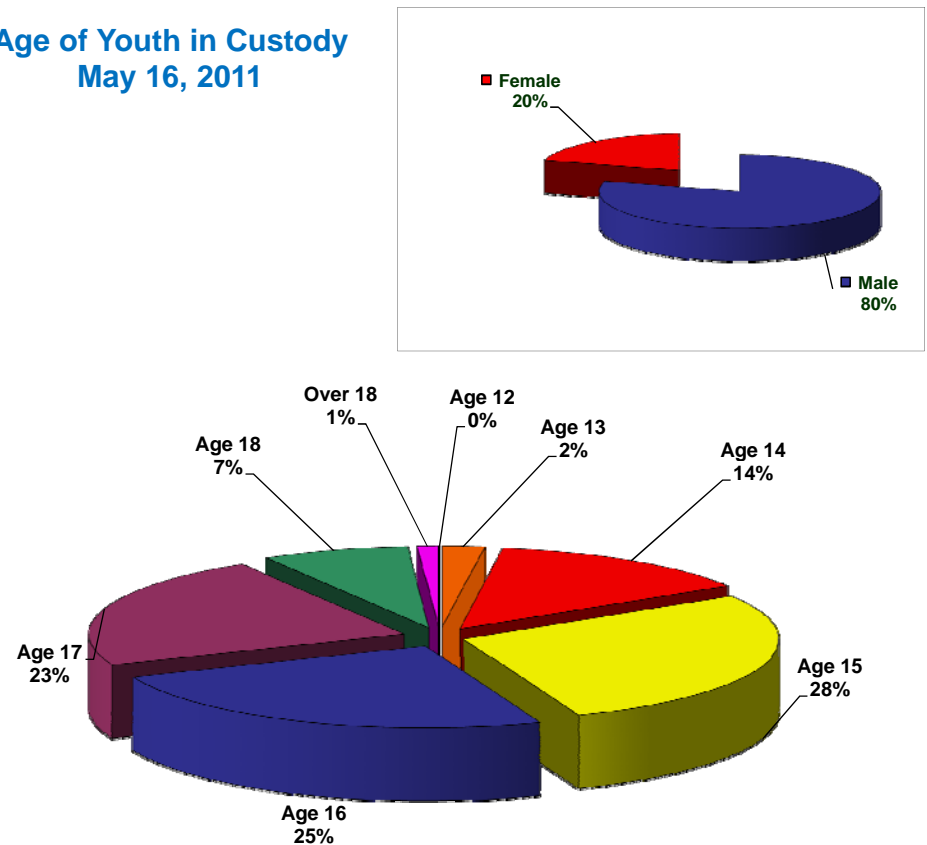

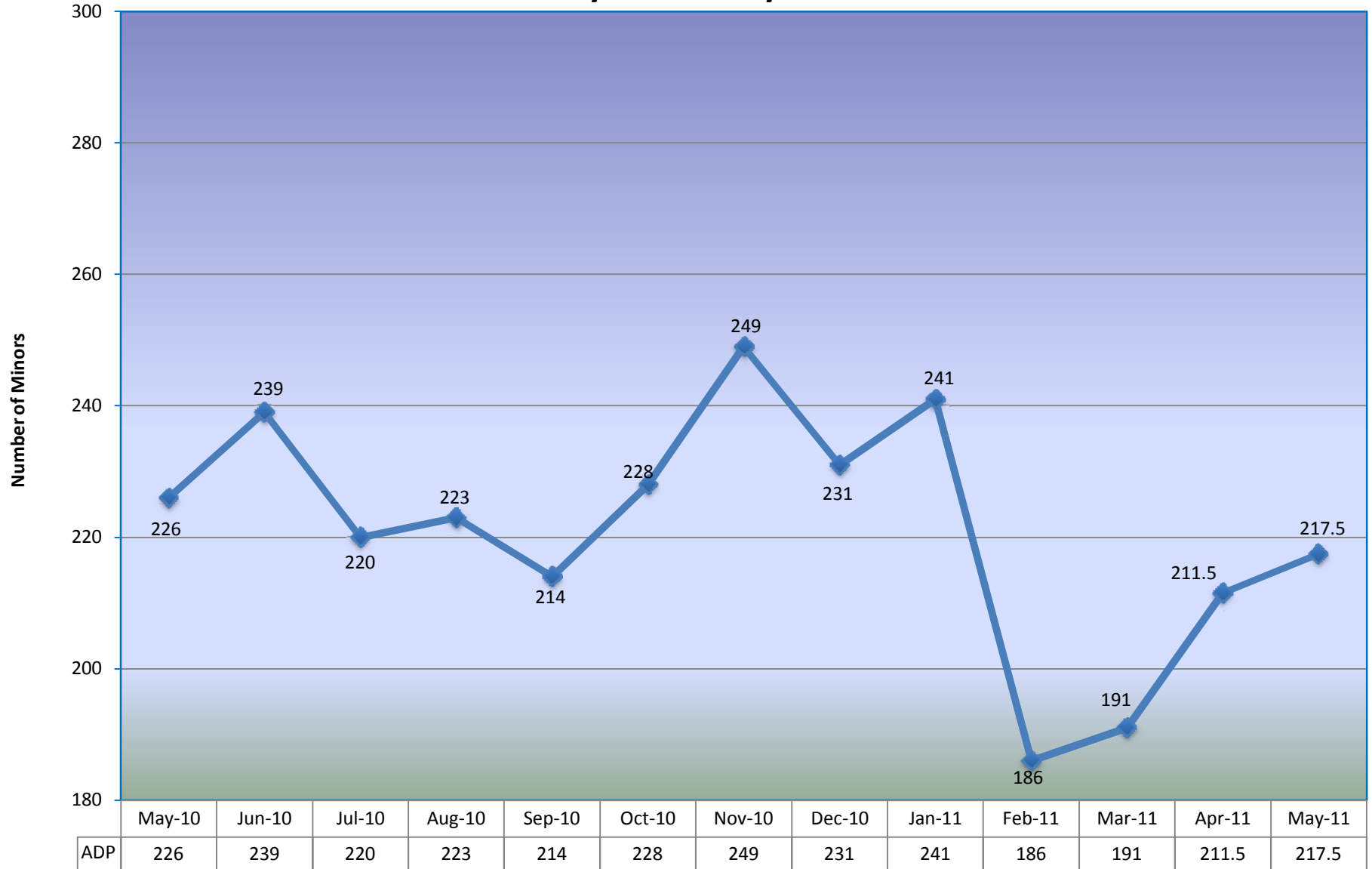

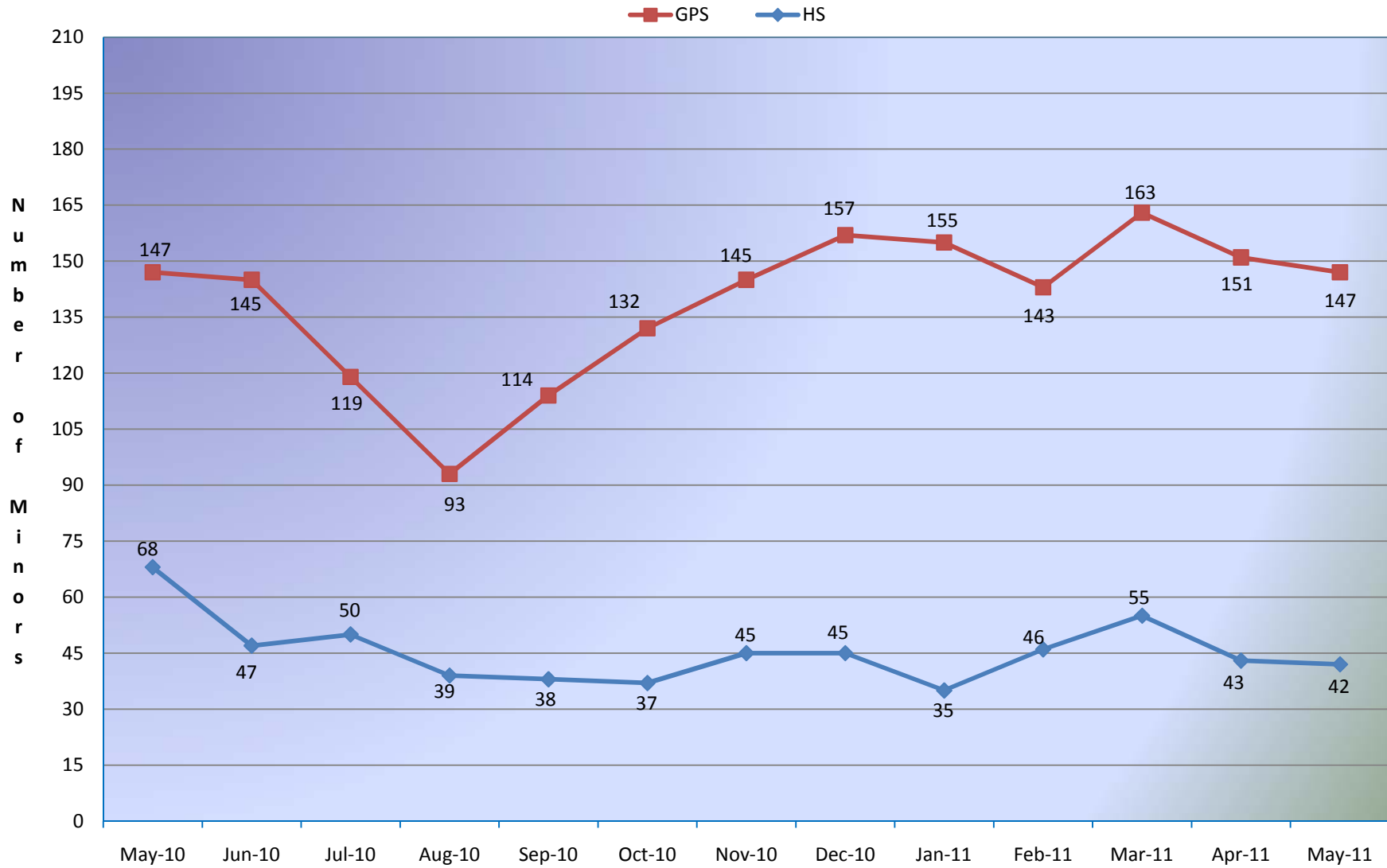


## JUVENILE HALL AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION \* (ADP) May 2010 - May 2011

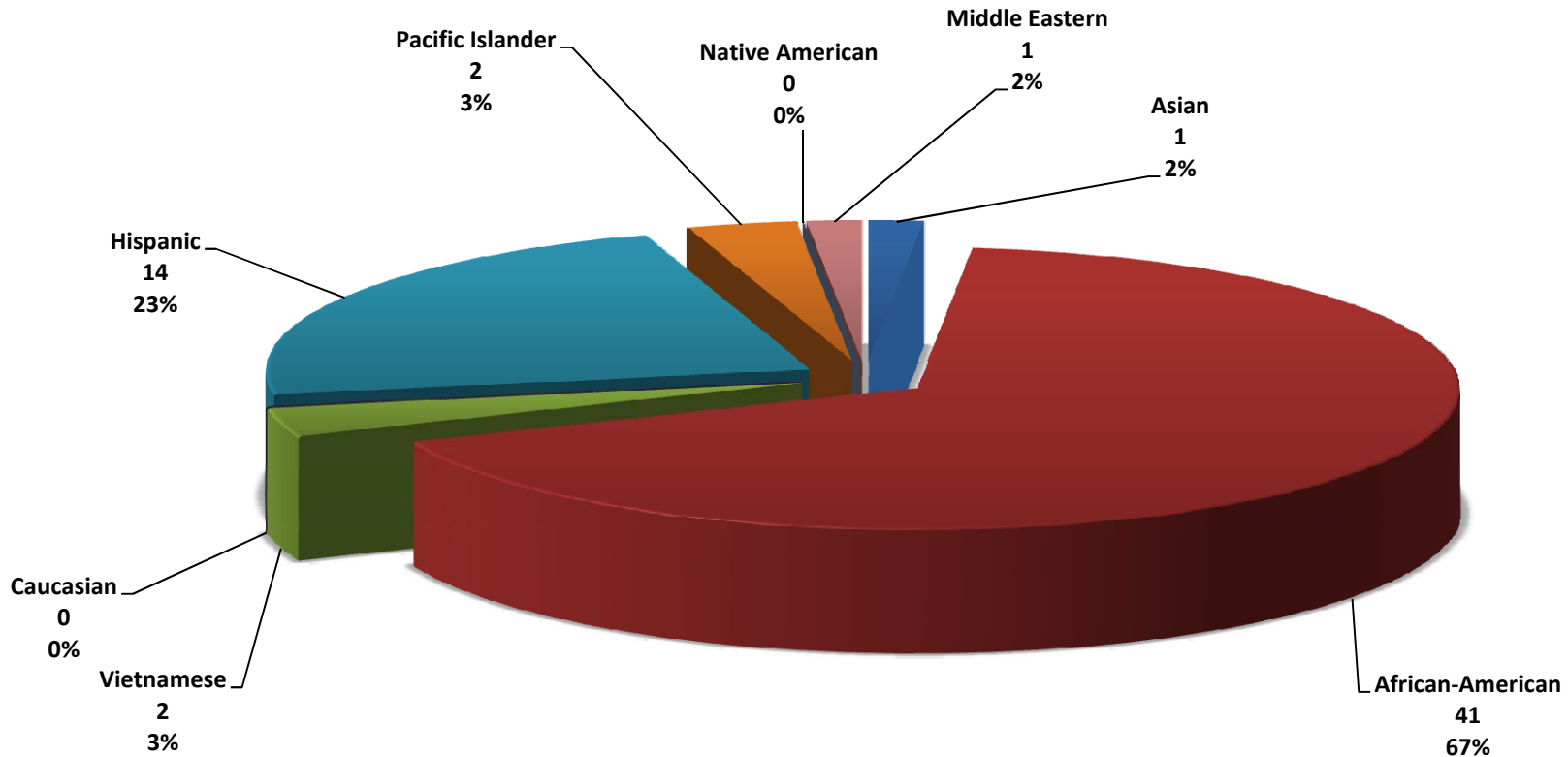

# CAMP WILMONT SWEENEY ADMISSIONS BY ETHNICITY

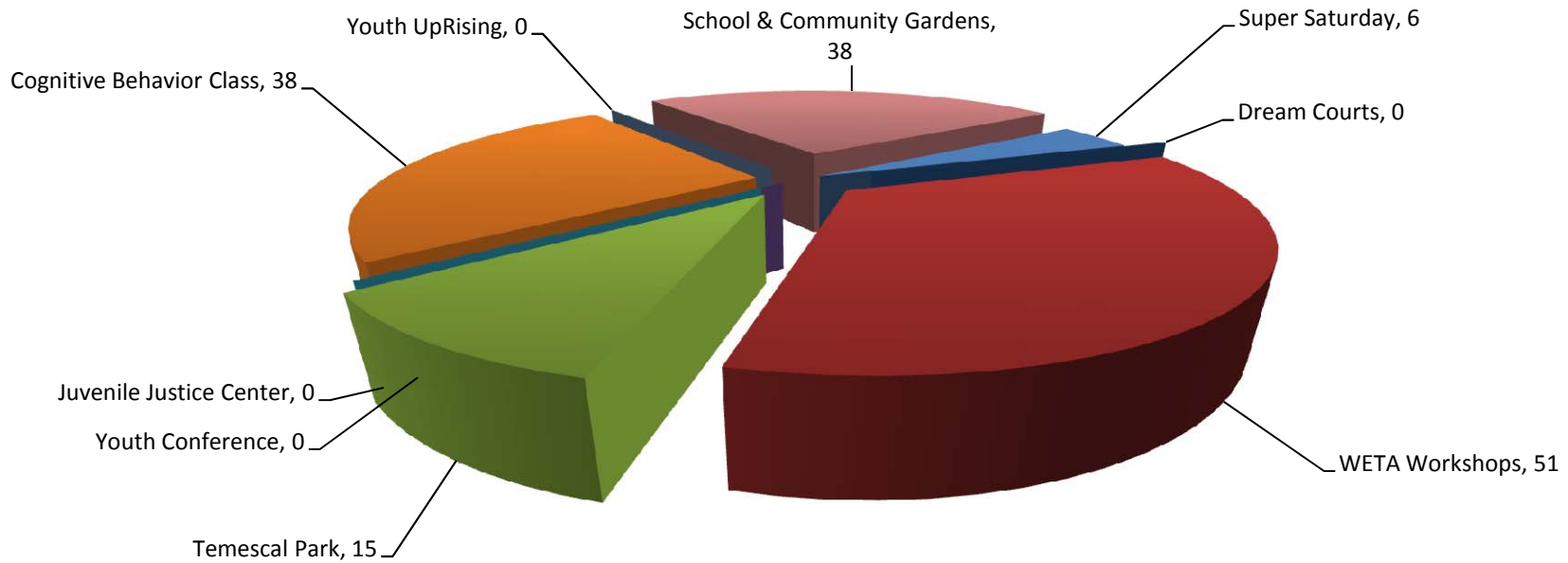

After completion of the in-camp program minors graduate to after-care furlough supervision services for a six-month period.

**Tasks (dependent upon worksite):**

- \*Weed Abatement - the removal of weeds in areas of worksite.
- \*Landscaping - clearing of dirt paths, pruning shrubs, etc.
- \*Grounds Clearing/Cleanup - disposing of garbage & plant trimmings.
- \*Loading items onto Truck - various objects, debris (nothing heavy).
- \*Ditch Digging - irrigating purposes of specific areas.
- \*Spreading Wood Chips - laying out over wide sections of worksite.
- \*Pruning - cutting back and shaping plants.
- \*Litter Removal
- \*Car Wash - car washing at specific sites.
- \*Inventory - Institutional Supervisor assigns where, what, when.
- \*Fence Building/Repair - assisting ranger with construction of fencing.
