## **Adult Recidivism Definition**

Recidivism is defined as conviction of a new felony or misdemeanor committed within three years of release from custody or committed within three years of placement on supervision for a previous criminal conviction.




# RECIDIVISM ALAMEDA COUNTY





## Realignment Housing Program: Exits by Destination Types: FY 15/16





  - Two (2) Requests for Applications (RFA) for the two rounds of the CCF Planning Grants; and
  - One (1) RFA to hire two CCF Technical Assistance Providers.
- Developed scopes of services for the seven (7) categories of funding
